1. ___ Biology 10 is UC and Cal State transferable and meets the science with a lab requirement.
2. ___ The goal of this course is to provide students with the basic knowledge and understanding of biology so that they will be more capable of making educated decisions.
3. ___ Biology 10 is a 4.0 unit semester course
4. ___ Biology 10 can be taken as just a lecture course, lab is optional.
5. ___ Attendance is mandatory to your success, an attendance card must be initialed every class period in order to receive full credit for attendance. Missing lecture will result in not earning all points possible for attendance.
6. ___ 25% of the final course grade will be determined by the laboratory performance. Successful completion of Biology 10 requires successful completion of Bio10 lab.
7. ___ Any student that receives a failing grade in lab, regardless of their lecture grade, will receive a failing grade for the entire course.

9. ___ There is a lecture web site, specific to your class, where you will be able to access information specific to your lecture course and download lecture handouts.
10. ___ All questions you have in lecture must wait until after lecture to be asked. Office hours are the only place in which questions can be answered.
11. ___ You should turn cell phones, iPods, & MP3 players OFF BEFORE entering the classroom.
12. ___ The study questions at the end of the lecture handouts are extremely useful in studying because many of the questions will be used on the exams.
13. ___ If you miss a lecture, not only will you not be able to sign the attendance sheet but you run the risk of missing quizzes (which can not be made up)!
14. ___ Students can come and go during an exam as long as they let their instructor know where they are going (ie bathroom, answering cell phone etc.)
15. ___ Any student arriving late, after the first student has turned in their exam, will NOT be allowed to take the exam.
16. ___ If you miss an exam you can take up to 5 weeks following the exam to make it up.
17. ___ On the day of an exam, NO personal belongings will be allowed to be around at your desks. All books, purses, notes, etc. must be brought to the front to the classroom or left outside the classroom. The only things you may have are pencils, erasers, scantrons, & pens.
